Statement of Purpose

IN JUNE 1967 jet aircraft and motor torpedo boats of the Defense Forces of the State of Israel brutally assaulted the American naval intelligence-gathering ship, *USS Liberty*, while in international waters off the coast of the Sinai Peninsula in the Mediterranean Sea. The attack was preceded by more than six hours of intense low-level surveillance by Israeli photo reconnaissance aircraft, which buzzed the ship as low as 200 feet directly overhead. The carefully orchestrated assault that followed was initiated by high performance jet aircraft. This was followed by slower and more maneuverable jets carrying napalm, and was finally turned over to lethal torpedo boats, which blasted a forty-foot hole in the ship's side. The attack lasted more than two hours, deliberately killing 34 Americans and wounding at least 171 others. Over 821 rocket, cannon and machine gun holes were inflicted. When the *Liberty* stubbornly remained afloat despite her damage, Israeli forces machine-gunned her life rafts, firefighters, stretcher bearers, and sent helicopters carrying troops to finish the job, no survivors were to be taken.



At this point, with Sixth Fleet rescue aircraft supposedly en route, the government of Israel apologized and the identity of the assailants became known.

Details of the attack were hushed up in both countries. Israel claimed that her forces mistook the *Liberty* for an Egyptian ship, and our government quietly accepted that excuse despite evidence to the contrary. No ship in our history has ever received such damage and casualties by accident. Then our government downplayed the intensity of the surveillance and the severity of the attack, and imposed a news blackout on the crew to keep the story under control. The official version is that the *Liberty* was reconnoitered only three times and only from a great distance. The American people were told that the air attack lasted only five minutes and that it was followed by a single torpedo and an immediate apology and offer of assistance. Nothing could be further from the truth. In June 1982, fifteen years after the assault, crewmembers reunited for the first time in Washington, D.C. It was a tearful, joyful reunion in which the men not only released their pent up emotions and decided that the **USS Liberty Veterans Association** would be formed with the firm goals of finding all crew members, holding reunions, proper recognition of Captain and crew (in particular those who lost their lives), obtaining a Congressional investigation into the attack, and...

TruHistory Films Releases Sacrificing Liberty movie

"The USS Liberty coverup is over!" That is how Matthew Skow announced the official release of Sacrificing Liberty.

Skow is the film director for the groundbreaking four-part docuseries produced and distributed by TruHistory Films, a Florida film company.

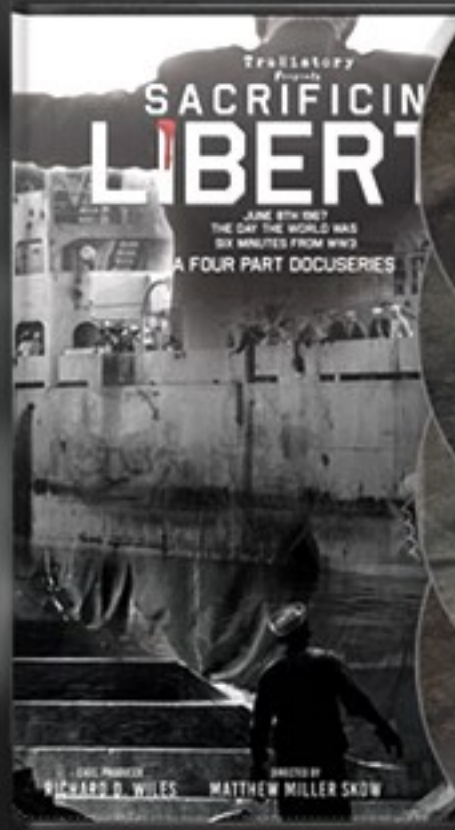
The project began in 2019 when Skow participated in an episode of Trunews, an independent digital news commentary program that originates from Vero Beach, FL. Trunews host, Rick Wiles, interviewed four USS Liberty veterans who told their story about what happened on June 8, 1967. Wiles and Skow were so shocked by the men's gut-wrenching testimonies that they decided the true story of the USS Liberty demanded a highly professional movie.

"The USS Liberty story ranks near the top of the biggest coverups in modern history," exclaimed Rick Wiles, the docuseries' producer. "We determined that somebody had to record the truth for the whole world to see and hear," he added.

Although other films have been made about the USS Liberty, Skow said his film is the first and only documentary that allows the veterans to narrate the film. Skow spent nearly a year recording hundreds of hours of video from numerous survivors.

The four-part film series is available at www.SacrificingLiberty.com for rental, digital purchase, and DVDs.

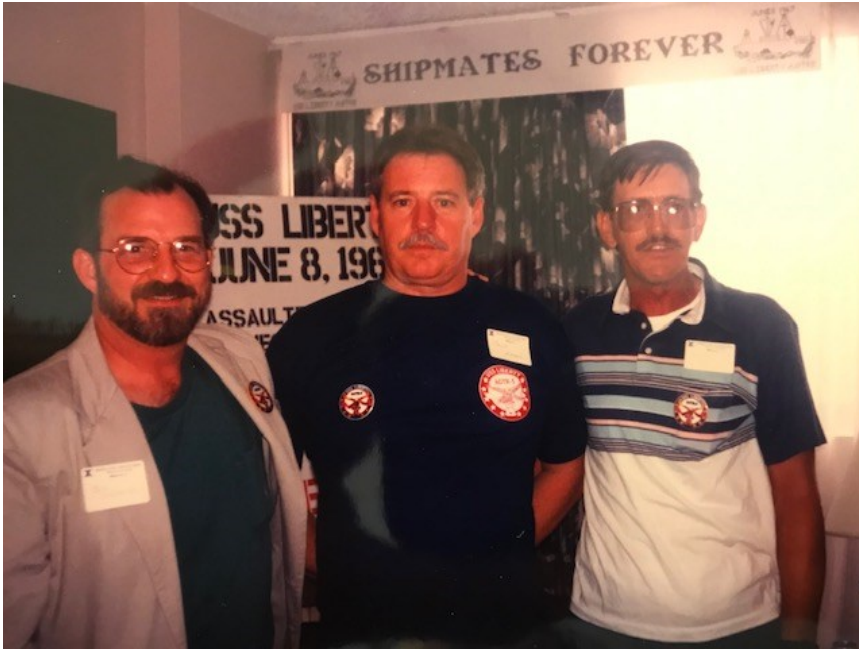

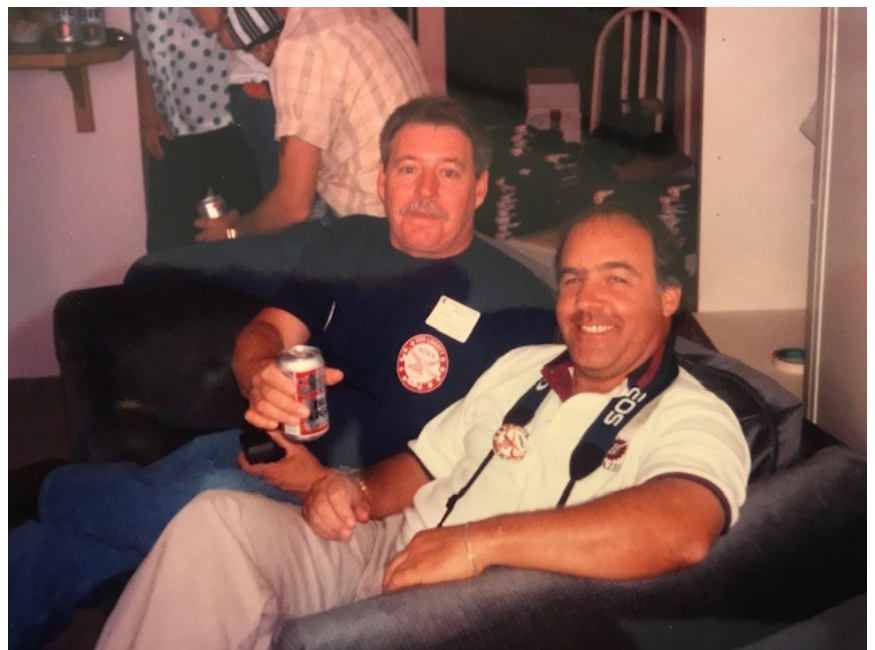

So much has happened in the past 54 years. Some incredible things have happened through these years. Some moments were also negative. This organization has stuck to its guns, doing all we could for the memory of our murdered shipmates. Most of all, to show our respect to them for the ultimate price they paid for America. The flag is there, and hopefully will be exhibited at the Annex, but who knows for sure.



“The Uniform Story” - By Run Kukal

I believe it was August of 2001 that the first History Channel documentary was shown. Not so long after the documentary was aired, Jim Ennes was inundated with emails about the program, from just about everywhere in this nation. He was so overwhelmed with those emails that he sent the overload to me to answer. I did answer all of them, but the one email that worked out well, was the one from the Hampton Roads Naval Museum, in Norfolk Virginia. A man by the name of Joseph Judge wrote this email, to which I did all the answering. We did exchange emails for a short while, until I realized that it would be to this nation's benefit, if the survivors contributed all they could to the museum for posterity's sake. My contribution was my own tropical white uniform, and that uniform remained on display at the museum for many years. It is only an estimate, but I think it was very close to fifteen years. I was never going to make any changes to the display, that is until the death of our own Master Chief Petty Officer Stan White. As the Chaplain for this organization I did go to Chief White's funeral at Sturgis, SD. and was able to speak at the funeral. It occurred to me that Stan's uniform was much more presentable than mine was, after all who could not see the difference between Stan's Dinner Uniform and mine.

Let me just say that Stan White became a close friend after we both had left the service, and I did visit him at his home which was close to Custer SD several times. Took my family with me, and they did enjoy both Stan and Laura. I remember our own Commander Dave Lewis saying how great Stan looked in that dinner uniform, so I felt it was my responsibility to make sure his uniform remained out there for the public to see, and consequently I did request for mine to come down, and his to go up in its place. The museum complied, and that is where the uniform is to this day. After this was accomplished, I talked Commander Lewis into sending his uniform to the same museum, and at first Dave was hesitant, but finally consented. Once the uniform was there, I did ask when it would be put on exhibit, and as luck would have it, the Covid thing was taking place at about the same time. There was only one person working at the museum, but this gal took it upon herself to make sure the uniform found a place, and even more gratifying she found a place for it at the Annex, on the Norfolk Naval Base. Hampton Roads Naval Museum has a downtown museum, and an annex on the base, and as far as I know that is still the case. The Annex as I understand it is right across the street from Admiral's Row, so Dave's uniform is certainly in the right place, wouldn't you agree? I know Dave never got so far as Admiral, but I think he would have made a good one. To add to this, there a few things we needed to iron out, such as the medals, and Dave never sent his hat, so Commander James Smith and Phil Tourney took care of that for me. I can't thank them enough, simply because they went overboard, and presented the flag that flew over the USS Liberty in 1966 to the museum, and that story has already been printed in the newsletter. So now we have the uniform of Stan White and Dave Lewis in a prominent museum, and as far as I know those uniforms will be there for a very long time.

Next we got to the Cold War Museum in Vintage Hill, Virginia where another one of my uniforms has been on display for a very long time. In my own personal opinion, I felt that there are other people who needed their uniforms displayed, so I requested mine come down, and Commander James Smith's uniform go up in its place. I requested Jim to send the uniform, to which he promptly complied. I am not sure the uniform is up yet, because the Covid thing caused a lot of delays in everything, even displaying Commander Smith's uniform. The Cold War Museum evidently lost their volunteer help because of it, so the Director Jason Hall was stuck doing their work, plus his own. I am still in contact with Jason, and have asked others in the area to go and help him out. Phil Tourney is now in the process of sending his uniform to the same museum, and they have promised to display Phil's also. This is all a work in process, but I am sure it will all happen.

This is the actual story of how the uniforms found their place, as near as I can remember. I am sure there could be some minor mistakes, but as my own life has been a whirlwind, I didn't really have the time to make notes. I counted the memorials that are listed on the Jim and Joe's USS Liberty web site, and near as I can tell there are around 70 of them, so let them try and revise that history, if they think they can.
